



This unique outdoor educational programme is run every year for the Grade 7 class at the end of April. It involves each pupil participating in a 5 day journey starting in the Langeberg mountains outside of Heidelberg and ending up at the sea at Infanta. The trip starts with the pupils hiking up the Groot Vaders Bosch river and over into the Groot Vaders Bosch forestry station. The next two days are spent cycling the back roads of the Eden District to the pont at Malgas on the Breede River. There the pupils exchange their bicycles for kayaks and the next two days are spent paddling down the Breede River. The final day sees them cycling towards Infanta and then hiking the last 10km towards the mouth of the Breede River. During the expedition the pupils are divided into groups of approximately 6 pupils with one staff member. Two back up vehicles support the group. Each pupil takes a turn to lead their group and all cooking and meal preparations are done by the groups. Along the way the pupils camp at designated campsites.
